# Coach's Report

T've spent the past summer reflecting on the 2022 season and have begun to appreciate the achievements at the IRA as a direct result of the persistence and hard work displayed over the past two years through the COVID-19 pandemic. Without a doubt, this time has been the toughest of my coaching career, and it was capped with another challenge in the spring: COVID cases were again on the rise and simply getting the group through the last two months and to the start line of the IRA without any large setbacks took a monumental effort. I owe a huge THANK YOU to Sam, Brandon, and Jack for helping with that effort and for guiding the group towards that goal of racing at the IRA at full strength. Hopefully we will continue our return to 'normal' this

I am so proud of the character the team has displayed over the past 12 months and for all that we achieved together. fall, and the student-athlete experience will be free of testing and pandemic protocols!

With that said, this past year has been an incredibly successful one for the team in all respects: we achieved the lofty race results, academic achievements, and fundraising targets we set as our objectives each year. I am so proud of the character the team has displayed over the past 12 months and for all that we achieved together.

Impressively, the Varsity 8+ was dominant and consistent all year. A 10-second victory at the Washington dual, followed by a six-second win at the Pac12 Championship, raised expectations going into the IRA. The crew stepped through the heat and semi without being pushed and set up a clash against Yale (and others) in the final. Our competitors knew they needed to throw everything they had at the first 500m to try to stay with us; still, our crew was able to stay composed in those opening strokes and consistently moved away. The middle 1000m was just incredible to watch as they moved out every stroke to break open water, controlling the race to win by 2 seconds and capping the first undefeated season since 2001! The calm and confidence the crew displayed throughout

the season, and then the execution under pressure of their best race of the IRA final, makes me enormously proud.

The JV 8+ had an incredible year as well with a strong win at the Washington dual, an epic come-from-behind victory at the Pac12, and then a gutsy race to fend off the rest of the field and finish second at the IRA. Their goal was always to race to win, and I am proud of how they absolutely emptied themselves in that attempt. I am also impressed with how they conducted themselves through a tumultuous last few months of the season.

We had great results in our lower boats as well. The 3V 8+ won the Washington dual and the Freshman 8+ won a Pac12 Championship; the Varsity 4+ also claimed both of those races as a sign of great depth in the program. All year, it was emphasized that this campaign would be about the full team, and as a result we had some great performances and positive contributions to the team culture from our 5V/6V group. They have contributed greatly to the competitive environment and positive team energy that pushed all our boats on to these race results and, ultimately, the Varsity 8+ to a National Championship!

The strength displayed this year was also evident in the classroom. The crew finished the spring semester with a team GPA of 3.4 which puts us in an advantageous position to likely win the Newmark award for Top Large Men's Team at Cal for the fifth year in a row. The insistence that excellence on the water and in the classroom can be pursued, and more importantly, achieved, is the foundation of our team culture and I am thrilled to see the squad doing both at such a high level.

After the IRA, we took a short break before assembling a group to train towards Henley Royal Regatta. Our internal standard to earn the trip over to England is to win the Pac12 Championships or IRA, so the opportunity was extended to those in the Varsity, JV, and Freshman 8+s, all who had won the Pac12 Championship. Some shifting around in those lineups did occur due to other commitments or visa issues, but the core of the Varsity 8+ entered the Ladies' Plate, the Freshman 8+ entered the Temple Cup, and the JV 8+ broke into two coxed fours to race in the Prince Albert Challenge Cup.

The expectations of the athletes at all the events were the highest I've ever seen. Still, through a tough week of racing, we were able to get two crews (Ladies' Plate and Prince Albert) into the finals on Sunday. Both crews raced incredibly well but ended up losing those finals. Regardless, giving 28 young athletes the opportunity to compete in and experience Henley was special, and I want to thank everyone that contributed to making the trip possible!

As we prepare for a new school year and new campaign to win Pac12 and IRA Championships, I want to extend another thank you to everyone who supports this program. I am extremely grateful to be guiding Cal Crew, and to be able to provide to this generation of young men the life-changing experience of studying and rowing at Cal. We would not have the elite program that we do without the support of all of you.

A very special thank you is due to Sam Baum, who has been with me for the past four years and will be transitioning a new position outside of collegiate rowing. Sam displays remarkable talent in recruiting ideal young prospects who are extraordinary oarsmen, students, and human beings. Recruiting the right personalities that will invest in the team and gel as a unit is not an easy task. The National Championship title, the depth of our squad, and the cohesion of the team from top to bottom is all due to how good Sam is at his job.

On a bittersweet note, Jay Peart has also decided to end his tenure as our boatman. Jay has been a great part of our team for the past six years and his commitment to Cal Crew - and his dry humor! - will be sorely missed. We wish Jay all the best and know he will stay connected to the team for years to come.

I am, however, excited to welcome Jason Elefant and Dave Adams as my new assistant coach and the team's new boatman respectively, and look forward to working with Brandon, Jason, Jack, and Dave this coming year.

The challenge now shifts to building a team culture and work ethic for a completely new year. We can make no assumptions that past victories will inevitably lead to future results, and the group of 65 student-athletes that convened on August 24th will need to make the most of this year. I, like you, am eager to watch them write their own chapter of history.

#### Varsity 8+

The Cal Varsity 8+ began its historic season by competing at the Las Vegas Invite. There, the Bears knocked off the top boats from Drexel University, Oregon State University, University of San Diego, and Santa Clara University. Then in April, the Bears competed in the inaugural Pac12 Challenge at Redwood Shores where they beat Boston University and the University of Wisconsin by 19 seconds each. The Varsity knocked off Northeastern University the next day. The Bears then dominated the University of Washington two weeks later in the annual UW dual, defeating the Huskies by an impressive 10 seconds. They went on to nearly replicate that achievement at the Pac12 Championships when they bested Washington by six seconds. At the IRA National Championship, the Bears had a comfortable win in their heat over Syracuse and Northeastern, and in the semifinal were able to outrow both Washington and Harvard. The Bears established an early lead in the Grand Final over Yale and continued to pull away in the second and third quarters of the race. The Cal Varsity 8+ bested Yale, Brown, Washington, Syracuse, and Harvard, claiming the National Championship.

#### Junior Varsity 8+

The JV8+ began its season in Las Vegas, where the team dominated Drexel University, Oregon State University, University of San Diego, and Santa Clara University. The JV beat Boston University by 10 seconds at the Pac12 Challenge before defeating Wisconsin later in the day. At the UW dual, the Bears established a lead by the 1000m mark, and triumphed over the Huskies by roughly three seconds. At the Pac12 Championships, the JV8+ had one of the most impressive races of the season for any Cal boat when they reeled in the Washington JV after being down by a full length at the race's halfway point. The Bears caught the Huskies in the final ten strokes of the race, securing an impressive win by less than half of a second. By bringing that momentum into the IRA, The Bears were able to win their heat over Syracuse and their semifinal over Brown and Princeton. The Bears then battled Yale and Dartmouth for the entire final, passing Dartmouth in the last 500 meters but coming up just short to Yale, ultimately finishing with a silver medal.

# Racing Highlights continued

#### Third Varsity 8+

The 3V8+ began its season in Las Vegas, where it bested Oregon State University and Santa Clara University. Then, at the Pac12 Challenge at Redwood Shores, the 3V8+ beat the University of Wisconsin by 11 seconds and Oregon State University by 27 seconds. The 3V8+ had a dominant performance at the Washington dual, by establishing an open water lead by the 1000m mark and beating Washington by eight seconds. The Bears could not match Washington's fast start at the Pac12 Championships, falling to the Huskies by less than a boat length. At the IRA, the 3V+ finished second in its heat behind Brown and third in its semifinal behind Yale and Washington. In the final, the Bears fell behind in the first 500m and worked to catch the other crews for the rest of the race. The Bears 3V8+ ended by finishing in fifth place.

## Forth Varsity 8+/V4+

This year, the Bears fielded a fourth varsity 8+ to compete both in Newport at the California Challenge Cup and on the Oakland Estuaryat the inaugural Ebright Invitational. In Newport, the Bears beat all other UC crews in the lead-up to their final against the Cal Freshman; unfortunately, the final was cancelled due to inclement weather. At the Ebright Invitational, the Bears dominated the top crews from University of San Diego, UCSD, and Santa Clara University. The V4+ got an early lead on Washington at the Washington dual and continued to open the margin all the way down the course, crossing the line 26 seconds ahead of the Huskies. At the Pac12 Championships, the battle between the Bears and Huskies lasted half the race before the Bears stepped out and won by 13 seconds. The Bears 4+ had a tough time trial and semifinal at the IRA National Championship, finding themselves in the B-Final. The Bears had their best race of the regatta in the B-Final, finishing first in the race and seventh overall.

#### Freshman 8+

The Freshman 8+ started their season in Newport at the California Challenge Cup. Here, they bested all other UC crews in the run-up to the cancelled final against the Cal 4V8+. At the Ebright Invitational, the Bears knocked off the second crews from the University of San Diego, UCSD, and Santa Clara University. The Freshmen had a slow start at the Washington dual falling behind Washington early on. Ultimately, the Bears lost by just over half a boat length. At the Pac12 Championships, the Bears flipped the result on the Huskies, rowing with composure in the first 1000m and taking a move to row through Washington in the second half of the race. The Bears won by roughly a boat length.

# V8+ National Champions

## For the first time since 2016, the Cal Men's Varsity 8+ are National Champions!

The Bears came into the IRA National Championship on the back of an undefeated regular season which was highlighted by a commanding ten-second victory at the Cal vs. Washington dual and a six-second win against the Huskies at the Pac12 Championship. In the IRA final, Cal and Yale distinguished themselves in the first 500m. Then, the Bears began to inch out in front of the Bulldogs and continued to extend their lead through the middle 1000m of the race. With 500m to go, our Bears had a

boat length lead, impressively finishing over two seconds in front of Yale. This season marked the first time the Bears Varsity had an undefeated domestic season since 2001. Congratulations to Luca Vieira, Iwan Hadfield, Elliott Kemp, Tim Roth, Ollie Maclean, Gennaro Di Mauro, Angus Dawson, Frederik Breuer, and Campbell Crouch on winning the 18th National Championship for Men's Rowing and the 100th overall for the Cal Athletic Department!



# Trip to Henley

To commemorate the entire team's successful season, four boats of student-athletes traveled to Henley-on-Thames, England to race at Henley Royal Regatta. The Bears entered the Pac12 Champion Freshman 8+ in the Temple Challenge Cup, two 4+s of JV and 3V athletes in the Prince Albert Cup, and the Varsity 8+ in the Ladies' Challenge Plate. The Bears Varsity 8+ and the "A" 4+ entry each made the Henley final, but unfortunately each boat came up just short of winning their race. Racing at Henley provided the team with valuable and fun international racing

experience and allowed them the opportunity to represent Cal on the global stage. Our trip to Henley Royal Regatta was made possible by donors like you and the generosity you showed over the course of the 2021-2022 season. Your donations covered equipment rentals, travel expenses, Henley blazers, and event entrance fees for our student-athletes. Thank you to all who contributed towards the Henley trip and supported the Bears both in Henley and from home!

# Fundraising Report

The 2021-2022 academic calendar, spring racing season, and fiscal year have marked an exciting return to our normal school, team, and fundraising operations. To the coaches, administrators, and student-athletes who endured uncertainty and frustration while ensuring our best performances on the water and in the classroom: Thank you, and well done!

The team's ability to train as a healthy squad, coupled with the hard work of coaches and athletes, has allowed the team to enjoy tremendous success all year, highlighted by the Varsity 8+'s undefeated season and National

Championship performance. Kudos are due for this fantastic accomplishment! What's more, we were able to catch up with many alums as Cal Crew community members from as far as South Africa and Australia were permitted to congregate and support the Bears in person. It was great to see faces both familiar and new at the races.

Critically, the team's efforts on the water were enthusiastically matched by those of the Friends of Cal Crew donors. The vitality of our program relies heavily on the support of our alumni, family, and friends. Each year the Friends of Cal Crew is charged with filling a substantial budget gap and we depend upon the philanthropic leadership of our community to meet this challenge. With help from a generous one-to-one match from one of our donors, the Friends of Cal Crew aims to raise \$800,000-\$900,000 of the team's \$1.3 million operating budget. This target

can be reached if our community strives for 100% engagement. Thanks to the largesse of you, our donors, we raised \$678,000 from over 900 gifts before receiving our match! These extraordinary contributions have provided enough funding to cover our program for another year.

This year's fundraising campaign was marked by exceptional outpourings of generosity during both Giving Tuesday and the day of 24-hours-straight Cal fundraising, the Big Give. On Giving Tuesday, over \$73,000 was raised from 160 gifts. Similar success was seen during Big Give when we raised over \$60,000 from 178 total gifts. The impressive amount of Big Give funds allowed Cal Men's Crew to boast the most gifts

received of all teams in the athletic department; in fact, we nearly doubled the number amassed by the second-place team. What's more, our superior donor turnout resulted in the Cal Athletic Department gifting Cal Men's Crew an allotment of prize money that further boosted our fundraising numbers. This year's fundraising efforts have also enabled us to set the foundation for a new scholarship! Finally, nearly 100 alumni gathered at the boathouse for the Cal Crew dinner and auction. Guests represented a 60-year span of graduating classes, from the class of 1962 to the class of 2021. At the auction, thanks to your generosity, we were able to raise nearly \$40,000 for the Henley Royal Regatta trip, and another \$40,000 for other Friends of Cal Crew operations! It goes without saying that the auction was an enormous success and an exciting way for alumni of all ages to celebrate Cal Crew together. We hope to see many of you at this year's dinner and auction in October!


