As August draws near and we are busy prepping for the new class of athletes to arrive in a few weeks, I wanted to take a moment to look back and share some of the highlights and successes of the 2019 season. As I think back on the year, the themes that emerge are the high level of training intensity throughout the fall and winter, continuing our academic success, and the squad having the confidence and resiliency to improve through the entire spring racing season.

We began the spring racing season a bit earlier this year with the top two boats racing at the Las Vegas Invitational and our Third Varsity and Freshman 8+s traveling to Newport to race in the UC Challenge Cup. The Varsity and Second Varsity started the year off with convincing wins over Cornell, Oregon State, and Marist, while the 3V and 1F won their races against the top boats from all of the other UC programs.

After an exciting Class Day Race where the Seniors powered away to win, we traveled south to race in the annual San Diego Crew Classic. Our Varsity and Second Varsity lost tough races to Yale while the Third Varsity and Freshman 8+ won their respective events comfortably. The dual racing season began with sweeps against Hobart and Wisconsin before the team traveled up to Seattle to race the Huskies. After a lost seat on the first stroke, the Second Varsity hung with UW well and finished just under two seconds behind. In the Varsity race, we exploded off the line and got out to a 7-seat lead around 900m into the race; Washington then started to move back, drawing level with 600m to go and inching away to win by under a length. They were tough losses for both boats, but the crews learned a lot from the racing and drew confidence that they had the speed to win.

After a successful sweep at the Stanford dual, the team focused on the buildup to the Pac 12 Championships. Our Second and Third Varsity 8+s and Varsity 4+ raced well but lost close races to Washington. The Varsity focused on finding a more sustainable rhythm and pushing in the second half of the race and the guys executed the race plan with incredible poise. Washington shot out off the line and worked its way out to nearly a length lead by the 1000m mark,

but the oarsmen kept their internal trust and moved back to pull within one seat with 15 strokes to go, ultimately falling by just over a second. Not the result that we wanted but progress made and momentum built off of another tough loss.

With exams finished, we traveled to Chico for a short camp before the IRA. We were able to get a few key guys back from injury and made switches between the boats giving both of the top two boats a boost of momentum. At the IRA, we were one of only three programs to have all of our boats (V8+, 2V8+, 3V8+, V4+) make the A-final which is a great sign of the team's depth. The Varsity raced aggressively in the final, putting themselves in a position to win through the middle of the race but faded in the final 20 strokes and Harvard was able to pip them at the finish

line for 3rd. I'm proud of how they raced; they can all hold their heads high knowing that they were brave enough to go for the win even if it left them empty in the final stretch. The highlight of the regatta was the Second Varsity powering away to dominate the final. They led from the first stroke, pushed out to a ¼ length of open water at the 1000m mark, and went on to win the National Championship by a length!

It was a solid year of results and I'm impressed with the resolve that the guys showed through some adversity and injuries. The goal and expectation will always be to win every single race that we are in but, win or lose, the lessons learned from the journey will stick with these young men for the rest of their lives.

We continue to excel academically and maintained our team GPA of 3.10. We won the Newmark award for top GPA for a large men's team and had 15 student-athletes named to the Pac 12 All-Academic team and a record nine who won IRA All-Academic honors. Senior Maarten Hurkmans also won the award for Pac 12 Scholar-Athlete of the year to follow up on Natan Wegrzycki-Szymczyk winning the award last year! I am continually inspired by the academic pursuits that our guys are undertaking including architecture, mechanical engineering, business, history, physics, and political economy among many other majors.



I want to thank all of the seniors for their contributions to the team over the past four years. Joachim Sutton, Ferdinand Querfeld, Jack Gosden-Kaye, Elliot Rogers, Hunter Hodges, Leon Ramm, Marcin Pawlowski, and John Amorosana have left an indelible mark on the team during their time at Cal and it will be felt for years to come.

I also want to thank Sam Baum and Brandon Shald who have come on as assistant coaches this year and brought an energy and positivity that have made a massive impact on the squad. They have a passion for what they have chosen to do as a profession and their influence over the guys as they walk up the stairs or into the erg room every day is visible. This energy has extended to our recruiting efforts and I fully expect to see that pay off in the years to come as we build relationships with the top coaches and recruits from across the US and around the world. Jay Peart has played a pivotal role in keeping everything running smoothly at the boathouse. I'm thrilled with the staff that we have right now; the squad can feel the cohesion and fun that comes from the leadership of the team and that has a positive impact on the team culture.

We wouldn't be able to provide this life-changing experience for this group of young men without the support of our alumni, led by Andy Rogers and the Rogers Family. Andy's steadfast commitment to the team and the time that he and Friends' president, Steve Dettlinger, dedicate to making sure the team has everything that we need is what makes it possible for the crews to pursue excellence on the water and in the classroom. A heartfelt thank you to both of them. I also want to take a moment to recognize that we lost an important member of our alumni family this year with the passing of Shirley Friedman. Rodney and Shirley have been long-standing supporters of the team and have developed wonderful relationships with the athletes over the years. Her calming presence at the regattas will be sorely missed. We will endeavor to notch another Henley win in her honor!

Thank you all for your support of the team.

Junior Varsity 8+


This year's National Champions had a solid start to Spring with a win right off the bat at the Lake Las Vegas Invitational. At the San Diego Crew Classic, Cal led Yale to the 1750m point where a last-ditch effort from Yale resulted in a close win for the Bulldogs. The Second Varsity saw three more regular season wins at the Stanford Invitational, Oregon State Dual, and Stanford Dual. The crew was unsuccessful in its first two bouts against Washington at the UW Dual and Pac 12's but showed good speed in the week before the IRA National Championship. At the IRA the boat made short work of the heats, qualifying with the fastest time by 6 seconds. In the Semi-final the JV dueled with Washington, far ahead of the rest of the field, and won the rematch of the Pac 12s, again with the fastest time. The Grand Final was a repeat of the Semis, Cal controlled the race start to finish winning the National Championship.

Varsity 8+

The program's top boat saw stiff competition from the outset of the season, facing off against last year's national champions in a single dual style race at the San Diego Crew Classic. Cal rowed well against the crew from the East but were outmatched. The Varsity recorded a number of wins over the course of the season against Wisconsin, Stanford, Cornell, Oregon State, Marist, and Hobart. The boat had an exciting race against UW on the Montlake Cut. Cal had a blistering start and was off to an early lead which was extended to a length by the middle of the race. Entering the Cut the two crews clashed oars as Washington made their big move. This proved a costly distraction to the Cal boat who were unable to regain the strong rhythm they had had at the beginning of the race. Two more attempts were made to beat UW at the Pac 12 and IRA Championships, but these too were also unsuccessful despite some favorable changes to the line-up.



Third Varsity 8+

The Third Varsity 8+ dominated the start of their season, winning their first 4 races at the San Diego Crew Classic, Stanford Invitational, and UC Challenge Regattas. Conditions proved challenging at the Washington Dual and UW took an early lead in the race. Cal's crew fought back the whole way down the course but were unsuccessful in their attempts to retake the lead. Another string of victories followed at the Oregon State and Stanford Duals. Before the Pac 12 Championship the Third Varsity enlisted the help of some promising freshman but this was not enough to take back time on Washington, who had also improved their boat in the interim between races. Two weeks later at the IRA National Championship the young crew earned valuable experience through determination as they battled to make the A Final.



Freshman 8+

Cal Crew's newest members started their season with an impressive result at the 3-mile Princeton Chase, winning their event by over 15 seconds. The crew backed up this victory at the start of the regular season in the UC Challenge where they also gained experience about collegiate racing. The Freshman remained undefeated through the San Diego Crew Classic and Stanford Invitational. The crew met their match against Washington on the Montlake Cut where they finished a length down on the Huskies. The Freshman's last two races, however, saw them return to victory, beating Oregon State and Stanford in Dual style races. The decision was made not to race the Freshman 8+ at the Pac 12s, but instead to use its members to bolster the ranks of the 3V8+ and V4+.

Varsity 4+

The Varsity 4+ proved to be a competitive boat again this year. The crew, despite only racing the Pac 12 and IRA Championships, saw large improvements in a small amount of time. At their first race, the Pac 12 Championship, the Varsity 4+ held close to UW for the entire race but were outdone in the final sprint. Seat racing in the week leading up to the National Championship regatta resulted in a number of changes. The new crew showed serious grit in their final race where they and UW traded punches once again. The lead was transferred between the two crews a number of times, the end result being a very tight finish between Cal and Washington far ahead of the rest of the field.

Since the beginning, the program has faced a number of challenges with funding, a lot of this stemming from rowing not being a profit sport. No programs make any real money from ticket sales to games or merchandise. Because of this, Cal Rowing has had to be very resourceful over the years, changing funding sources a number of times.

As the inception of the program, the athletes paid Boating Association membership dues which funded the Crew. By 1906 the ASUC, seeing the program as one that had a positive effect on campus life, absorbed the financial responsibility thus alleviating the financial burden on the athletes. This ASUC funding lasted until 1960 when a formal Athletics Department was formed within the University and they took over the responsibility. University funding began to fade shortly after that as the costs of all sports increased. Martin McNair, head coach at the time, decided that the decreased support called for more personal involvement from alumni. In 1967 the Alumni Rowing

Club (ARC) was formed of ex-rowers, each of whom donated back to the Crew, helping to alleviate the financial burden McNair and his program faced. By 1978 the economic situation in the Athletic Department had fully deteriorated. The program faced the choice of either competing at the San Diego Crew Classic or the National Championship, but not both, due to the extra costs associated with team travel. The ARC countered this ultimatum set by the University by raising \$22,000 to fund the IRA trip.

To raise this money, the ARC decided it needed to adopt a broader and more inclusive stance on its membership. During the 1978-79 season, the ARC became "The Friends of California Crew" to include those who had not rowed but still supported the program (parents, relatives, friends, and other supporters). From this point forward, the University and the Friends agreed that the Athletics Department would fund the in-season racing, and the Friends would raise funds for any post-season trips like the IRA National Championship and Henley Royal Regatta. For the next decade, the FOCC averaged \$40,000 in donations each year; now the Friends raises over \$450,000 each year to help support the program and the student-athletes that represent it. It is the ultimate goal of the Friends of California Crew to endow the program and keep Cal Crew Forever.

This year's 2019 Cal Athletics Hall of Fame class has been announced and we are proud to say that the 1964 Men's Varsity 8+ was elected to be enshrined later this year. The '64 crew is the 7th crew to be inducted into the Hall of Fame and joins 10 remarkable athletes and coaches from Men's and Women's Rowing.

Cal's varsity 8 completed an undefeated season in 1964, winning the Pacific Coast Duel Race Championship, the Western Intercollegiate Championship, and the IRA Championship – the first crew in Cal history to claim all three titles in one season. The boat later competed at the 1964 Olympic Trials and advanced all the way to the final where they were beaten by Vesper Boat Club, a crew of older and more experienced men. Allen Rosenberg, the then coach of Vesper, wrote a note to the Cal Coach, Jim Lemmon, after the race which read "... May I take this moment to tell you and your fine crew that we are, and always will

be, impressed and reminded of a great, determined group of sportsmen. There were many competitors at New York. We think of California as the only sportsmen".


Each Fall, we are eager to start a new year on the water along with seeing old friends and excited to make new ones. On August 13th freshman parents and coaches' broke bread at Gather restaurant in Berkeley during the student-athlete move-in weekend. Head Coach Scott Frandsen said a few words about lie ahead for these young men and welcomed this new parent's group to the Cal Crew family. Six weeks later, The Friends of California Crew hosted alumni and parents during Homecoming weekend.

We held a dinner for parents and the team at the 67 Canyon house on Friday night and a tailgate on Saturday. Friday night at Canyon saw parents meeting their

student-athletes' teammates and each other, helping forge new friendships and grow our community stronger. After the cocktails and a speech from the President of the Friends, Steve Dettlinger, parents and athletes enjoyed a catered meal from Everett and Jones Barbeque. For Saturday's tailgate before the Cal vs. UCLA Football game, we decided to try something a little different and hosted our event in Tailgate Town on Maxwell Field, right next to the stadium. Our private tent with food and drinks drew a crowd of 60 alumni, supporters, and their families.

A day that has become very special to Cal Crew is Giving Tuesday. We saw our entire team volunteering in the East Bay and cumulated nearly 200 hours of combined community service in just 12 hours. The three main focuses of the endeavor were cleaning the public outdoor spaces, aiding the elderly, and engaging with Oakland's youth to motive and inspire them. Student-athletes participated in the cleaning of Lake Merritt and the surrounding area; helping North and South Berkeley Elderly Centers with lunch preparation and service; aiding the senior citizens at Redwood Gardens Senior Center by moving boxes and reorganizing living spaces; speaking to students at Parker Elementary about the importance of team sports and staying active. Our donors stepped up on this day of giving, raising over \$42,000 from a staggering 110 gifts in 24 hours. 
This enthusiasm was on full display a few weeks later at Alumni Day. Despite the rain at the beginning of the event and the threat of continuing inclement weather throughout the day, alumni, parents, and friends showed up in force to catch up with old friends and make new ones. The wind made conditions challenging on Class Day. The event was live-streamed to our Facebook page for supporters. The Seniors won the day on both the Men's and Women's teams, defending their titles from the previous year. Later, in what turned out to be a beautiful evening, 130 guests showed their support for the program at the 2019 Dinner and Auction. This year the event was back at the University Club where guests shared a spectacular view of the Bay Area as the sunset. After dinner and a moving video that was enough to give any alumni goosebumps, the auction was underway. Supporters bid and outbid each other on prizes in the name of raising money for Scholarships that offer Student-Athletes from around the world the opportunity at a life-changing experience as part of Cal Crew. The night was a huge success and put us well on the way to reaching our goal.

The Big Give was next on the calendar, and only a few days after the auction, again the incredible support of our community was shown. Cal Crew had the most donations of any sports team at a little over 80 (33 of which were current athletes) and raised over \$35,000. By this time racing had already begun, starting with the team split between Las Vegas, NV and Long Beach, CA for some early season competition.

At the San Diego Crew Classic, our local alumni association organized a Cal tent located right near the finish line. Supports from all over came to cheer on our Bears. The Cal spirit's next stop was in Seattle. Our crews traveled north for the historic Cal vs. UW Dual joined by a dedicated group of parents and alumni from making the journey. Parents from out of state and overseas joined local alumni and our athletes for dinner at Piatti in Seattle on Friday night before the big Dual. Racing was back in California for the IRA National Championship, and we saw a fantastic crowd under the Cal Tent organized by the Friends. Spectators cheered on our crews as they came down the racecourse and past the beach. The weekend was highlighted by drinks and appetizers at the Cattlemens in Folsom on Saturday night, and the National Championship won by the JV on Sunday morning. This thrilling conclusion to the year could not have been possible without the support of our fantastic community.
