# **Coach's Report**

As we approach the end of the summer, I wanted to recap the 2017 racing season and point out the highlights of another successful campaign. Our first regatta of the spring was the San Diego Crew Classic. Our crews all performed well winning all five marquee events (Varsity 8+, 2nd Varsity 8+, 3rd Varsity 8+, Freshman 8+, and the Open 8+). The highlights were the Varsity 8+ and 2nd Varsity 8+ beating highly ranked Yale and both the Freshman 8+ and 3rd Varsity 8+ beating the California Rowing Club by open water. Next came the annual dual with Wisconsin where once again all boats rowed to open water victories over the Badgers. These races allowed us to fine tune the line-ups for the 106th Cal vs. Washington Dual. The Showdown of #1 Washington vs. #2 Cal proved to live up to all of the pre-race hype. The Freshman 8+ started the day with a five second win over the Huskies. Both the 2nd Varsity 8+ and the 3rd

Varsity 8+ battled hard but lost by close margins to Washington. In white cap conditions, both Varsity 8+ crews battled stroke for stroke. As the two boats approached the historic Montlake Cut, Cal was able to take a slight lead and increase it over the last 600 meters to win by 2.8 seconds. This was the third year in a row that the Schoch Cup was contested by #1 vs. #2 with the Bears winning all three. That same afternoon, we traveled down to Oregon State where all crews won by open water. The last dual of the season was the Big Row at Redwood Shores against Stanford. We were able to sweep the Cardinal in all the races which capped off another undefeated dual season for the Varsity 8+ and Freshman 8+.

The Pac-12 and IRA Championships proved challenging for our squad; we were battling illness to some of our top athletes.

The Freshman 8+ concluded their season with a five second win at Pac-12's, but the Varsity 8+, 2nd Varsity 8+, 3rd Varsity 8+, and Varsity 4+ all lost in close races with Washington. At the IRA, we were one of only three schools to put boats in the grand final of all four events and brought home the second most medals of any program. The 5th place finish in the Varsity 8+ is an obvious disappointment and I take full responsibility for the loss. I think that I made too many changes to the lineup-up but I am proud of how our guys fought and persevered through the regatta. The 2nd Varsity 8+ had an incredible sprint finish to win a silver medal in one of the closest races I've seen at the IRA, where 2nd through 4th were separated by just .15 seconds! The 3rd Varsity 8+ claimed the bronze in a tight race between Washington and Harvard. The Varsity 4+ raced well and won the silver with three freshmen and a novice rower. Next season we will have seven returning from the Varsity 8+ and seven from the 2nd Varsity 8+. We will return everyone from the 3rd Varsity 8+ and an undefeated Freshman 8+ crew. These, along with a strong incoming class, ensures our Team will be strong in the future.

After the IRA, we sent a group overseas to compete at Holland Beker Regatta in Amsterdam and at Henley Royal Regatta in England. This was a mixed crew of student-athletes from the 2nd Varsity 8+, 3rd Varsity 8+, and Freshman 8+. The young crew competed well in Holland finishing in 2nd place to the U23 Dutch 8+ which included Cal sophomore Maarten Hurkmans. After Holland Beker, the group flew to England to compete at Henley Royal Regatta in the Temple Challenge Cup. Our boat had a great week making it to the semi-finals where they came up short to the eventual winners, Oxford Brooks University. I was proud of the way our student-athletes conducted themselves and represented our University overseas.

Even more important than our racing results were the results our squad had in the classroom. Once again our Team achieved a team GPA of over 3.0. We had fourteen members of our Team achieve Pac-12 conference academic honors and six winners of IRA All-Academic honors. Justin Murphy won the Jake Gimble Prize which recognizes one graduating senior from Athletics who successfully integrates academics and athletics while exemplifying the Golden Bear spirit. Justin, along with our other graduating seniors: Kyle Flagg, Jackson Donald, Pete Stone, James Schiera, and Jonathan Mahoney, have meant so much to our program over the last four years and they will be greatly missed. Thank you seniors! The outstanding achievements in the classroom is a testament to how hard our student-athletes work off of the water.

I would like to conclude with a message about the loss of Cal Crew's most valuable member; T. Gary Rogers. Without Gary, the sport of rowing would not be what it is today. Gary is single-handedly responsible for the revival of rowing dominance on the West Coast. His vision has helped Cal produce fourteen of the last seventeen National Championships. Gary's decision to hire Steve Gladstone as head coach brought five National Championships to Cal and as the championship banners began to fill the boathouse walls, the University of Washington had to up its game. This would create a West Coast championship era that still thrives today. Gary loved rowing because of the life lessons the sport instills in its young athletes. He was so generous with not only his money, but also with his time. Guys on our Team would regularly meet with him to gain advice pertaining to: medical school, business, or life in general. Gary has left behind an incredible legacy and his spirit will live on forever within each one of our student-athletes and inside the walls of the T. Gary Rogers Rowing Center. On a personal note, I will be forever grateful to Gary for making it possible for me to coach the Golden Bears and for making Kay, John, and me a part of the Cal Crew family. His legacy will live forever!

# 2017 Racing Highlights



## Varsity 8+

The Varsity 8+ had a successful year with a second consecutive undefeated regular season. The 106th Cal vs. Washington Dual lived up to its storied reputation and gave way to an incredible fight from both teams down the Montlake Cut. "In the weeks leading up to the Dual we rehearsed our move repeatedly in two coxed fours. On race day, we didn't have our best start and we were behind but we all knew that our move was still to come. At 1K in, our coxswain John called a 'super-move' and we pulled away from Washington to claim our third consecutive Dual win," said 2-seat Martin Mackovic. The Varsity 8+ also claimed victories over Yale in San Diego, Oregon State, Stanford in the Big Row, Wisconsin, and earned silver at Pac-12's. The Varsity 8+ ended the year with a 5th place finish at IRA's.

The 2nd Varsity 8+ was a young crew all season and was comprised of seven under-classmen all year. The crew started the season strong by defeating Yale in San Diego. Heading into IRA's the 2nd Varsity 8+'s only losses were to rivals Washington. The 2nd Varsity 8+ event was the tightest race of the entire IRA championship regatta. Cal won silver finishing .05 ahead of Princeton who finished .1 ahead of 4th place Yale. This was the fourth medal in five years for the Bears in the 2nd Varsity 8+. Other season highlights include wins over Oregon State, Stanford in the Big Row, Wisconsin, and a Pac-12 silver medal.

## 3rd Varsity 8+

Leading up to IRA's the 3rd Varsity 8+ had a strong regular season winning races in San Diego, Redwood Shores, and in Oregon. They had a close race at the Pac-12 Championship and brought home a silver medal. At IRA's the 3rd Varsity 8+ finished off their season strong, winning a bronze medal behind Washington and Harvard.

#### Freshmen 8+

This year's class of 2020 had an impressive showing with an undefeated regular and championship season. For the third straight year, the Freshmen defeated Washington at the Dual by a commanding 4.9 seconds. From there, they continued their dominance with wins over Oregon State, Stanford, Wisconsin, and capped off their season with a second consecutive Pac-12 Championship win. With the dismissal of the freshmen event at IRA's, five of these nine freshmen would join upperclassmen in the 2nd Varsity 8+, 3rd Varsity 8+, and the Varsity 4+. Every boat that raced at IRA's this year had at least one freshmen; highlighting our team's depth.

Comprised of three freshmen and a novice transfer, the young boat raced well to earn a silver medal at IRA's.

# **Tribute to T. Gary Rogers**

While our season brought many happy moments, our community was deeply saddened with the

sudden passing of our most valued member, T. Gary Rogers. Our beloved alumni, mentor, benefactor, and friend passed away on May 2nd, 2017. Though our Cal family felt the loss deeply, it was incredible to see the outpour of support towards the Rogers family and program over the past three months. Gary, who graduated from Cal in 1963 was a four-year athlete at Cal and was named UC Berkeley All University Athlete. After graduating from Cal, he went on to have an amazingly successful career in business to which he became CEO of Dryer's Grand Ice Cream, Inc. for thirty years. He served as a former chairman of Safeway Inc.,

and Levi Strauss & Co. Much of Gary's success in business was influenced by his time rowing for Cal and he lived by the motto his coach Jim Lemmon taught him, "There is no such thing as can't; there is only won't."

On May 15th, two weeks after Gary's passing, two thousand people gathered at the boathouse to celebrate the life of this great man. It was an outstanding memorial service that helped paint a picture of just how many people's lives Gary has positively affected. The afternoon entailed words from the Rogers family and friends, and Cal Crew paid a tribute to Gary by having a "row-by" with seven oarsmen and no two seat; Gary's position in the 1963 Varsity 8+. The Bears also honored Gary by proudly wearing his initials surrounded by the bear insignia on each racing tank for the remainder of the season. Many people also honored Gary by supporting the T. Gary Rogers Endowment. Seventy-six people donated in his memory and over \$57,000 went to supporting our endowment or our annual fund. Gary will be missed greatly but his legacy will live on forever at the T. Gary Rogers Rowing Center. His generosity and love for rowing will continue to affect every student-athlete that ever wears the blue and gold.

**This year's 2017 Cal Athletics Hall of Fame** members have been announced and we are proud to say that Jake Wetzel '02 will be inducted along with nine other Cal alums. The Cal Athletics Hall of Fame features two hundred ninety-seven individuals and six rowing teams. This esteemed group is made up of some of the most dominant amateur, professional, and Olympic athletes in the World.

Jake attended Cal from 1998 to 2002 where he had great success winning a Freshman IRA Championship and three consecutive Varsity IRA Championships. Outside of Cal, Jake also had tremen-

dous results rowing internationally. He is a three-time Olympian who won a gold medal in the 2008 Beijing Olympics (Canadian 8+), took silver in the 2004 Athens Olympics (Canadian 4-), and finished seventh in the 2000 Sydney Olympics (USA 4x). Jake also became a world champion in 1999 (USA 4+), 2003 (Canadian 4-), and in 2007 (Canadian 8+). In 2006, Jake went back to school at Oxford University where he competed and won the prestigious Oxford/ Cambridge boat race. Last year, Jake was also named Pac-12 Rower of the Century, an award voted on by Pac-12 Network research teams, Pac-12 coaches, and Pac-12 athletes.



## The formal induction ceremonies are

**scheduled** for Friday, September 8th at the

annual Hall of Fame banquet at the Greek Orthodox Church Conference Center in Oakland. Jake and the new inductees will be honored on the field during Cal's September 9th football game against Weber State at Cal Memorial Stadium. Information on tickets to the banquet can be found online at bigcsociety.org.

Laurel Korholz '93 from the women's program will also be joining Jake in the Hall of Fame this year. She too is an Olympian and won an Olympic silver medal in Athens in 2004. The school's Hall of Fame is located on the west side of Memorial Stadium and is open to all ticket holders after each home game.

# **Rio Olympics Games**



Looking back to last summer, we had five Golden Bears compete at the Rio Olympics. Olivier Siegelaar '11 competed in his third Olympics in the Dutch 8+ and came away with a bronze medal! Three of the five were first time Olympians, including undergraduate Natan Wegrzycki-Szymczyk. Two months after stroking the Varsity 8+ to an IRA National Championship, Natan competed for Poland in the 1x and won the B Final coming in 7th place overall. It was a remarkable showing for a young athlete in his first ever Olympics. Marko Marjanovic '08 raced for Serbia in the 2x and competed well to finish in 10th overall. Nareg Guregian '10, another first time Olympian, competed for the USA in the 2- and finished in 11th. Will Dean raced in his second Olympics and competed for Canada in the 4x coming in 8th. All five of our oarsmen competed fiercely and represented our University proudly on the world's biggest stage.

# **Fundraising Report**

The Friends of Cal Crew had another successful 2017 year and your incredible support helped us achieve another first in our 149 year Cal Crew history- a third straight \$400,000 plus fundraising year. On top of this great achievement, we also take great pride in hosting events for our alumni, parents, friends, and supporters. This year had many opportunities for our community to reflect on their days of rowing and the bright future our program has ahead.

Each fall we look forward to Cal football, head racing, and meeting new and current crew families. We hosted four events to kickoff the year: our freshman parents' lunch, FOCC annual tailgate, our parents' dinner at the Canyon House, and Mike Fennelly's retirement party. Our freshman parents' lunch gives the new parents and current coaches the opportunity to meet for the first time and is a great chance for us to answer any questions that parents have regarding their student-athlete's transition to college. Both our FOCC tailgate and Canyon parents' dinner always has a nice turnout and is a perfect time for our community to meet and celebrate the start of a new rowing year. On December 10th, over 130


people packed the boathouse for dinner and a party honoring one of Cal Crew's most storied members. After 36 years of unparalleled loyalty and hard work, we wanted to send Mike Fennelly off with a bang. With a full house, we got the opportunity to hear from every head coach that has served with Mike and got to hear tales of our legendary rigger. Closing the night out was a speech from Mike Fennelly himself, which reflected on his time and experience over the years at Cal. It was arguably one of the best events that we have ever hosted and we still cannot thank Mike enough for his years of dedicated service. The fall season was filled with fun for our alumni, families, and friends.

Our fall fundraising season was highlighted by another record set by our community: \$50,000 raised during our 24-hour Big Give! We had over 80 donations in just 24-hours and we were again one of the top teams in all of Cal Athletics. That incredible support set us up for a great start to the new year.

As 2017 was underway, the FOCC hosted it's annual spring fundraiser. Over 170 members of our community gathered at Cal Memorial Stadium to celebrate our 2016 National Champions. As an organization, we are always trying to challenge ourselves and look for new ways to improve our events and our operations. This year's dinner and auction saw its first ever mobile bidding platform. This allowed attendees and non-attendees to bid on silent auction items whether at home or at the venue. As supporters sent texts to outbid one another, our silent auction revenue saw itself triple in comparisons to previous years. The rest of the event was a wonderful time as guests enjoyed dinner, meeting the student-athletes, our live auction, and a word from our coaches. All in all, we raised over \$70,000 that evening which supported student-athlete

scholarships, travel expenses, equipment, and team needs.

Our spring racing season has many high points on the water and provides opportunities for our community to cheer on the Bears together. The season started off with our annual tent at the San Diego Crew Classic and was filled with supporters and fans along the beach who cheered on the Bears to a sweep of the regatta. In Seattle, we hosted a dinner party for any alums, parents, or friends that lived locally or traveled to watch the Bears win a third consecutive Cal vs. Washington Dual. We capped off our spring season during IRA's in Sacramento with cocktails and



dinner at Cattleman's restaurant, BBQ lunch during racing, and a tent for all of our community members to watch racing from. It was another season full of fast racing, fun, and time with our Cal family.

The season's successes were reflected off of the water as we achieved our fundraising goal for the third consecutive year; raising over \$415,000. This three-peat is no small feat as it is the first time in program history that we have raised over \$1.2 million dollars in just three years! This incredible accomplishment is a testament to just how thriving our community is. This season we saw over 700 donation transactions and 400 contributions



from the alumni and friends of our program. Just a few highlights include: Our current parents giving over \$50,000, a record number of past parents that gave back, totaling \$10,000, and the group of young alums (under 30 years old) who helped generate over \$9,000 in contributions. Another major fundraising success is how much support our community contributed to our student-athlete scholarships. Between the auction and annual fund, we raised over \$100,000 for scholarships! These scholarship contributions go directly to our student-athletes and help them attend Cal, compete for a National Championship, and further their education at the #1 public university in the world. Like the phenomenal coaches and people that these scholarships are named after (Ky Ebright, Jim Lemmon, Steve Gladstone, Harold Pischel, and John Rhodes), the student-athletes that receive these scholarships often rank amongst the highest on the quad while earning top accolades in the classroom.

Without the help of our community, Cal Crew would not be able to keep up with our sport's constant need for new equipment and technology. Rodney and Shirley Friedman donated their fourth boat to our program, *The Golden Bear* 3, Finn and Kim Wentworth gave their second racing shell to help us add to our fleet, and Dick Rahl purchased our new drone to help us live-stream racing for our at home viewers.

The Friends of Cal Crew's ability to support the program relies heavily on membership fees from our participants. These fees are essential for our organization to be able to host events, produce mailings, and ultimately help Cal Crew. In January, the Board voted to increase these fees to the amount of \$300 to help

us avoid any budget deficits. If you have been down to the The T. Gary Rogers Rowing Center recently, you will have noticed several updates. With the help of the Rogers family, all of the National Championship photographs have been updated/reframed and the glass windows have been tinted to protect from future sunlight damage to these frames. Many of our hanging oar blades have also been updated and/or are in the process of being made. A big thank you to the Rogers family for helping update our great facility. The support from our Cal family is what has kept us at the top of collegiate rowing and one of the best programs within Cal Athletics. The strength of our community is at an all time high and we cannot thank everyone enough for the overwhelming support that they have shown which continues to set new standards for helping our student-athletes prosper and achieve excellence.
