Coach's Report

With the 2018 racing season officially in the books, it's time to reflect on the highlights of another successful year for Cal men's rowing.

On the heels of record performances in the championship 8+ and championship 4+ at the Head of the Charles, the team hit the ground running with all crews (V8+, JV8+, 3V8+, Fr8+, and Open 8+) recording wins at the San Diego Crew Classic. The weekend was certainly highlighted by the Varsity eight beating #1 ranked Yale by 2 seconds. At the Stanford invitational, we repeated our previous years' sweep of both Wisconsin and OSU by wide margins. The following week, Washington came to Redwood Shores for the annual Dual. Our Varsity, Second Varsity, Third Varsity and Freshman eights fell to the Huskies in close races, but the Varsity four came through with a big win for the program. Our crews were back on form at the Big Row against Stanford, sweeping Stanford again by big margins.

At the Pac-12 Championships, we were able to close the gap against Washington in the Varsity but fell short. The Varsity, Second Varsity, and Third Varsity eights, and the Varsity four all placed second to fast crews. The Freshman had a fantastic race and finished the season with a big win over Washington.

The squad travelled to Princeton for the IRA where we had strong performances by all our crews. We were one of only two teams that put every boat (V8+, JV8+, 3V8+, and V4+) in the grand finals and won medals in every event (V8+ bronze, JV8+ silver, and 3V8+ bronze).

I am proud of all 62 members of our squad and greatly appreciate their efforts this past year.

Our crew set another record in the classroom with the cumulative GPA rising above a 3.1 for the first time in memory. Each year, the standard of

academic success has been getting higher and more of our athletes are receiving recognition from the Pac-12 and IRA. This year we have 14 athletes on the Pac-12 All-Academic team and 6 in the IRA All-Academic team, 3 All Pac-12 First team awards, the Pac-12 scholar and Pac-12 rowing athlete of the year awards, and several awards given for excellence in academics and sportsmanship by the university. I want to give special recognition to the senior class; Jared Arat, Mark Brinker, Jack Cleary, Chris Duval, Colin Fitzpatrick, Max Hall, Martin Mackovic, Brett Nilsson, James Riley, Bennett Stahl, Alex Wallis, and Natan Wegrzycki-Szymczyk. I wish them the best of luck in their future endeavors.

I'd like to also recognize our staff for all their support and dedication to our program. Scott, Patrick, Tom and Jay consistently go above and beyond the call of duty and I feel fortunate to have been associated with each one of them.

Since this is my last report as your coach, I want to conclude by thanking T. Gary Rogers, the Rogers family, and Cal athletics for giving myself and my family such a positive, life changing experience! We are severely grateful to have had the opportunity to be a part of the Cal Crew family. We look forward to supporting the program under new head coach, Scott Frandsen, and believe Scott will bring Cal men's crew to greater heights for many years to come.

2018 Racing Highlights



Varsity 8+

The Varsity had a strong start to the year, setting the course record by over 30 seconds at the Head of the Charles in the Fall. The sprint racing season started equally well with a win over the top ranked school, Yale, at the season opening San Diego Crew Classic. Cal also recorded victories over Wisconsin, Oregon and Stanford at Redwood Shores. A hard-fought race at the 107th Cal Vs Washington Dual resulted in a second place medal for the Bears. Cal fought hard in their next encounter and significantly closed the margin set at the Dual at the Pac-12 Championships. At the National Championship, harsh conditions in the grand final proved difficult in every race. Cal finished in 3rd, one of only two boats to medal from the inside lanes that day.

2nd Varsity 8+

The 2nd Varsity, like the Varsity, won the Head of the Charles in the 4+ event. They had a dominating start to the spring season at the San Diego Crew Classic with wins over Yale and a fast crew from Northeastern. This intensity was carried forward to the Stanford Invitational where the JV dominated the competition again, this time against Wisconsin and Oregon. The Bears put up a good fight against the Huskies at both the Dual and Pac-12 Championships, but were unable to claim a victory despite the close race. A win over Washington in the semi final of the IRAs put the crew in good stead for the grand final the next morning. The stiff headwind in the grand final made for a long race where the Bears finished with a silver medal 2 seconds behind the winner.

3rd Varsity 8+

Leading up to the IRA's, the 3rd Varsity received a contingent from the Freshman 8+ who were eager to establish themselves among the upperclassmen. In New Jersey, the crew raced well in the heat and progressed to the semi final where, after an aggressive start, they earned a spot in the grand final. The 3rd Varsity, along with the Varsity, were the only boats to medal from lane 6, where the wind was worst. Prior to the IRA's, the crew saw victories in San Diego and Redwood Shores and placed second behind Washington at the 107th Dual and the Pac-12 Championships.

Varsity 4+

The Varsity 4+ had a notable season this year. The four had a tremendous race at the Dual, being the only Cal boat to claim a victory at the regatta. The crew took a length lead at the thousand-meter mark, then showed great fortitude as they held this margin to the finish despite the Husky boats' best efforts. They faced upset at the Pac-12 Championships after an impressive response from the Husky boat. After two more close races against Washington at the IRA's, the boat was unable to fight for the National Championship after bad weather resulted in a cancelation of the grand final.

Freshman 8

The class of 2021 was impressive all season. Racing experience from their win at the San Diego Crew Classic set the crew up for harder races in the weeks to come. At the Stanford Invitational, the Freshman bested the Santa Clara Varsity by 8.5 seconds. The Cal vs Washington Dual resulted in a one length loss to the bears, but the young rowers learned from their experience. Hard training in the following weeks resulted in a win at the Pac-12 Championships by beating the Huskies in the final race of the year.



4th and 5th Varsity 8+

This season, the 4th and 5th Varsities showcased the depth of the program. Not only did they have a strong showing at the Head of the American in the Fall, they also had wins over Hobart and Santa Clara at the Stanford Invitational and a win in the Open 8+ event of the Pacific Coast Rowing Championships (PCRC) in Sacramento during the Spring.

Tribute to Mike Teti

The tradition of California Crew has always been one of excellence. And while many of the coaches in Cal's history have been able to carry this torch, few have been able to do it like Michael Teti. Whether it's on the water or in the classroom, Teti has consistently expected his athletes to do more than just their best—he expected them to simply be the best.

One of only four head coaches in Cal's 150-year history to win a National Championship title for men's rowing, Teti coached the Varsity 8+ to two IRA gold medals. Off the water, he made a conscious effort to ensure each of his athletes made progress in the classroom, so it should come as no surprise that the program's overall GPA has reached a historical high. But Teti doesn't stop there: He reinforces the importance of consistency, reliability, and punctuality in every aspect of his athletes' lives.

These tenets are important to Teti's coaching because he recognizes that there will likely not be a multi-million-dollar sponsorship at the finish line of a collegiate rowing career. Despite this, a number of his athletes go on to successfully represent their countries on their respective national teams.

"He may not always show it on the outside, but he cares more than anybody," said one of his former athletes. This quote rings true in each aspect of his coaching and is reflected in his one-on-one meetings with every member of the team. Teti is a firm believer in each athlete's potential to make the top boat; he was just as invested in the success of the bottom eight guys as he was the top eight guys because he understands that each athlete pushes the one above him to be better.

The profound effect that Teti has had on the lives of his athletes is strongly reflected in the response of young alumni giving back to the program. More than twice as many young athletes who rowed under Teti give back in their first years out of college than under any other coach. It's not only a sign of the connection Teti established between the athletes and the program during their time at Cal, but also the positive impact he continues to have on their lives.

Thank you, Mike Teti, for your commitment to Cal's athletes, for your passion for coaching, and for your enduring words of wisdom.

This year's 2018 Cal Athletics Hall of Fame members have been announced and we are proud to say that Valerie McClain '82 will be inducted, along with nine other Cal alums. The Cal Athletics Hall of Fame features three hundred and seven individuals and six rowing teams. This esteemed group is made up of some of the most dominant amateur, professional, and Olympic athletes in the World.

Valerie attended Cal from 1978 to 1982 where she was one of the few varsity athletes to compete for both a men's and women's program. McClain raced as a coxswain for the men's crew in 1979 where, under Steve Gladstone, she coxed the varsity boat to an undefeated season and Pac-10 title. As a result, she became the first woman to earn a Big C letter in a men's sport at Cal. McClain remained in the eight for the Grand Challenge Cup at Henley, where she was the first ever woman to race in the event after Gladstone threatened to pull his crews from the regatta and alert the media should the stewards refuse to allow her to race. McClain coxed on the women's team in 1978, '81, and '82. She redshirted in 1980 after qualifying for the four in the 1980 Olympics. She later finished fourth in the four at the 1984 Olympics after winning 3 silver medals at the World Championships from 1981-83. McClain was also a member of the Women's Olympic Committee from 1974-78 and 1980-84.



Formal induction ceremonies are scheduled for Friday, Oct. 26, at the annual Hall of Fame banquet at the Greek Orthodox Church Conference Center in Oakland. Information on tickets to the banquet can be found online at bigcsociety.org. The new inductees will also be honored on the field during Cal's Oct. 27 football game vs. Washington at California Memorial Stadium. The school's Hall of Fame is located on the west side of Memorial Stadium and is open to all ticket holders after each home game.

The Friends of Cal Crew had an enormously successful year in 2018 thanks to the help of our parents, alumni and friends. This year, and for the fourth year in a row, the FOCC has raised over \$400,000 through our annual events and your generous donations. We, like the Cal Crew program, look for ways each year to set ourselves apart from the rest, and this year has been no exception.

Each Fall, we look forward to meeting new Cal families, seeing returning friends, and the excitement of head racing. The end of 2017 saw several events hosted by the FOCC and the inception of a new campaign designed to give back to the wider community. To kick the season off, we held a freshman parent's lunch where our incumbent families had an opportunity to meet our coaches and find out more about Cal Crew and how their student-athlete was making the transition to college life. Later in the Fall, we hosted the Cal Crew parents' weekend which consisted of dinner on Friday night at the Canyon rowing house and the FOCC tailgate on Saturday morning before the Cal vs OSU Football game. Both events had a wonderful turnout and it was great to see so many new and familiar faces celebrating the weekend together.

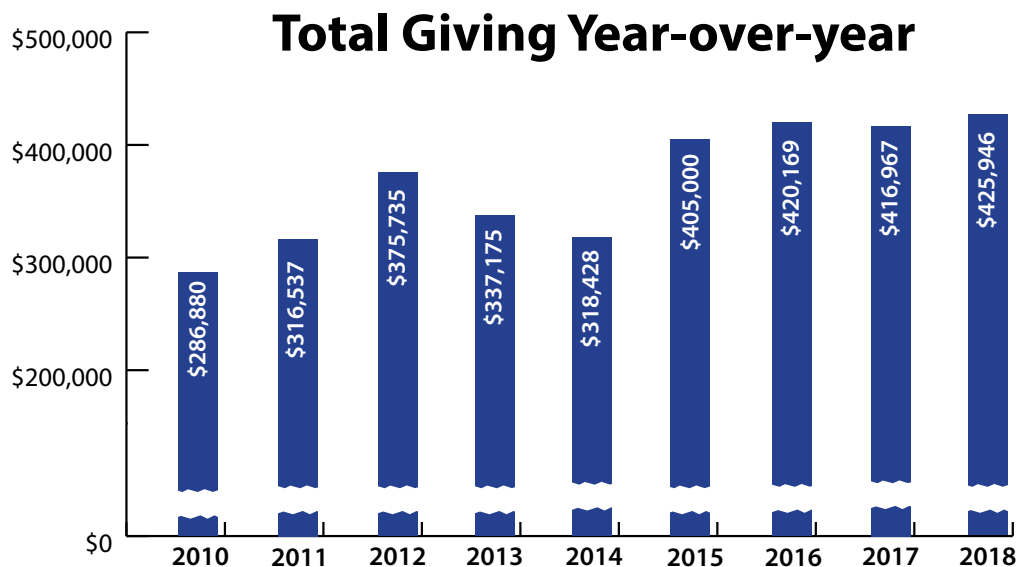
For the first time ever, Cal Crew participated in Giving Tuesday. On the Tuesday after Thanksgiving, over 60 student-athletes from the program volunteered 2 hours of their time over the 8

hour period to participate in activities around the East Bay at retirement homes, schools, churches, and boy's and girl's clubs in an effort to give back to the community. In return, our community helped us raise over \$50,000. This display of generosity from our rowers as well as the parents, alumni, and friends who donated, is a convincing indicator of the positive effect the program has on the lives of all who touch it.

After what was a strong start to the season, 2018 was quickly upon us and with it a host of exciting events and transitions. After being an integral part of the Friends for over 3 years, Cole Reiser moved on from Cal Crew and into an exciting new job in Dallas, Texas. University's annual Big Give event was held in the Spring this year. Despite being held in the same week as our annual dinner and auction, the Cal Crew community came together and helped raise the most out of any other program in the Athletics Department. This is the third consecutive year that Cal Crew has topped the rankings, not only in the category of funds raised, but also in the number of donations with over 30 contributors.

That Saturday, the Alumni Day had a terrific turnout at the T. Gary Rogers Boathouse with a mix of young and old alums and parents. The crowd consumed an incredible 571 Top Dog sausages during the lunch period while catching up with friends or chatting with current athletes. The morning was highlighted by the christening of the Shirley Friedman II and a \$1,000,000 pledge to Cal Crew by Rodney Friedman. His generous donation will go toward helping fund Cal Crew in perpetuity.

The giving continued later that evening when 146 recent grads, established alumni, parents, friends and current athletes ate, drank and outbid one another at the 2018 annual Dinner and Auction. The new venue, with state of the art visual and audio equipment and a view to rival even the University Club, saw our most successful auction to date. Conversation, laughter and charity dominated the evening and a stirring speech from recent grad and current US National Team member, Jordan Van der Stoep, gave insight into what the program hopes to achieve.

Jordan's speech highlighted the profound effect his time at Cal had on his life and stressed the importance of the scholarship that made his dream of

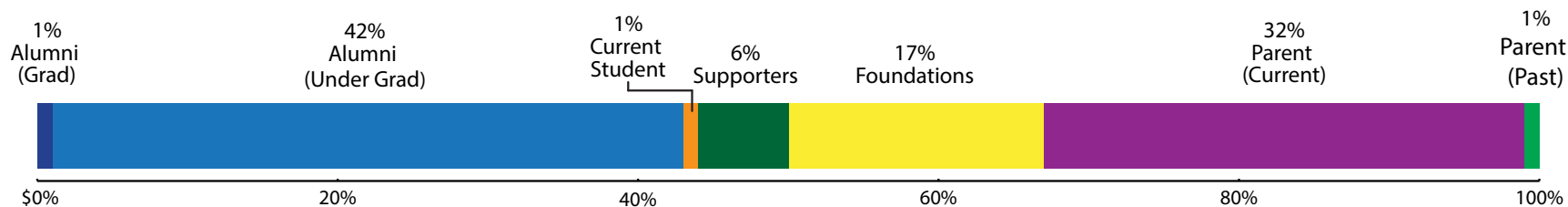
representing the state of California a reality. Each year, a handful of recruited athletes, who often would not be able to attend the University of California due to financial constraints, receive scholarships to help cover the costs of attendance. It is outstanding to see the remarkable gentlemen after whom these scholarships are named (Ky Ebright, Jim Lemmon, Steve Gladstone, Harold Pischel, and John Rhodes) honored in such a way.

The Friends of Cal Crew aims to raise money to service this exact purpose, the continued ability for young men to attend the #1 public university in the world and compete at the highest level of collegiate rowing. This involves scholarships, equipment, team needs and travel expenses. The first round of traveling this year took members of the team to San Diego where, with help from our alumni association, parents and friends could cheer the team to a full sweep of the races from a beachside tent close to the finish line.

A few weeks later, Cal dueled Washington and young alumni and friends gathered to celebrate the clash at a cocktail party at the Dorian in San Francisco.

Ultimately, the FOCC season's successes were reflected in the volume of funds raised. This season our community helped us raise \$426,000 to go toward scholarships, traveling costs and team needs. Truly, this is a staggering figure and could not have been possible without the kindness and generosity of our network of dedicated donors. The strength of this network is reflected in the sheer number of donations made. This season, over 350 individuals made donations, culminating in a total of 780 transactions.

When we break this figure down, we see huge involvement from current parents with nearly 30% of the funds raised from that group. A sign of the lasting connections built by our community is the continued involvement of past parents and recent graduates. The sustained participation of our parent group is amazing and is matched in intensity by our young alumni group. Each year, involvement of the young alumni increases both in number of participants and the volume of donations. This year more than 45 past parents and young alumni gave back to the program.

The Friends of Cal Crew relies heavily on the donations of members to continue our support of the rowing program. These fees are an essential element in our ability to host events, produce mailings, run the organization and ultimately ensure the longevity of Cal Crew.

Looking back over the last decade, our community has grown in strength and will continue to do so long into the future through the enthusiasm of our supporters. We cannot thank you enough for helping to raise the bar through your tremendous support and for helping our student-athletes grow and prosper through excellence.
